

## TURATON CONCERTS

### “A CONCERT OF SACRED MUSIC” 18-9 JUNE 1986

A concert of sacred works was presented by Turaton at Shepparton’s St Augustine’s Church on the 18<sup>th</sup> of June and at St Mel’s Church on the 19<sup>th</sup>. The concert was conducted by Charles Hamilton and featured soprano Maria Riccardi as guest artist.

Included in the program were Pergolesi’s “Magnificat”, the final chorale and chorus from Bach’s “St John Passion”, “Oh How Lovely Are Thy Dwellings” from Brahms’ “German Requiem”, Mozart’s “Ave Verum Corpus” and the “Gloria” from the Twelfth Mass by Vivaldi, “Jesu, Joy of Man’s Desiring”, “All in the April Evening”, and Faure’s “Requiem”.

- “In These Delightful Pleasant Groves”

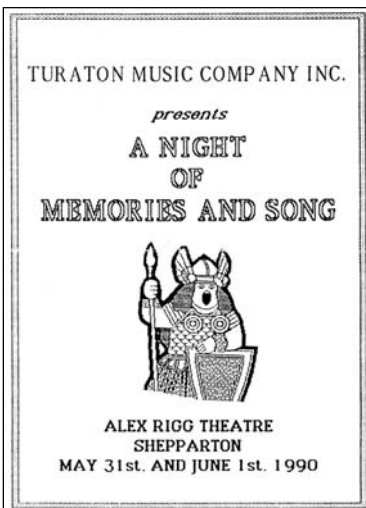
