 "Weary Dunlop's medical achievements, compassion, dedication, resourcefulness and courage not only endeared him to all who had contact with him but he has made him a "symbol of inspiration to the human spirit and to the spirit of Australia".
 Australian of the Year 1977 Sir Edward died in Melbourne July 2, 1993.

Turaton was honored to be asked to lead the singing at "A Tribute To Sir Edward Weary Dunlop" on 29th of September 1993 at which 11 photographic portraits of Sir Edward, taken by Dale Wright, were displayed.
